Good morning ladies and gentlemen. I echo the Acknowledgement of Country given by Christopher Donohue earlier and pay my respects to the Wanaruah people, and their elders past, present and emerging.

Today is a special day for our local economy and the Muswellbrook Chamber congratulates Malabar Coal on bringing this project to reality. The Chamber welcomes and congratulates you on your over \$220m investment and your persistence in navigating the NSW Planning Approvals process. 


